

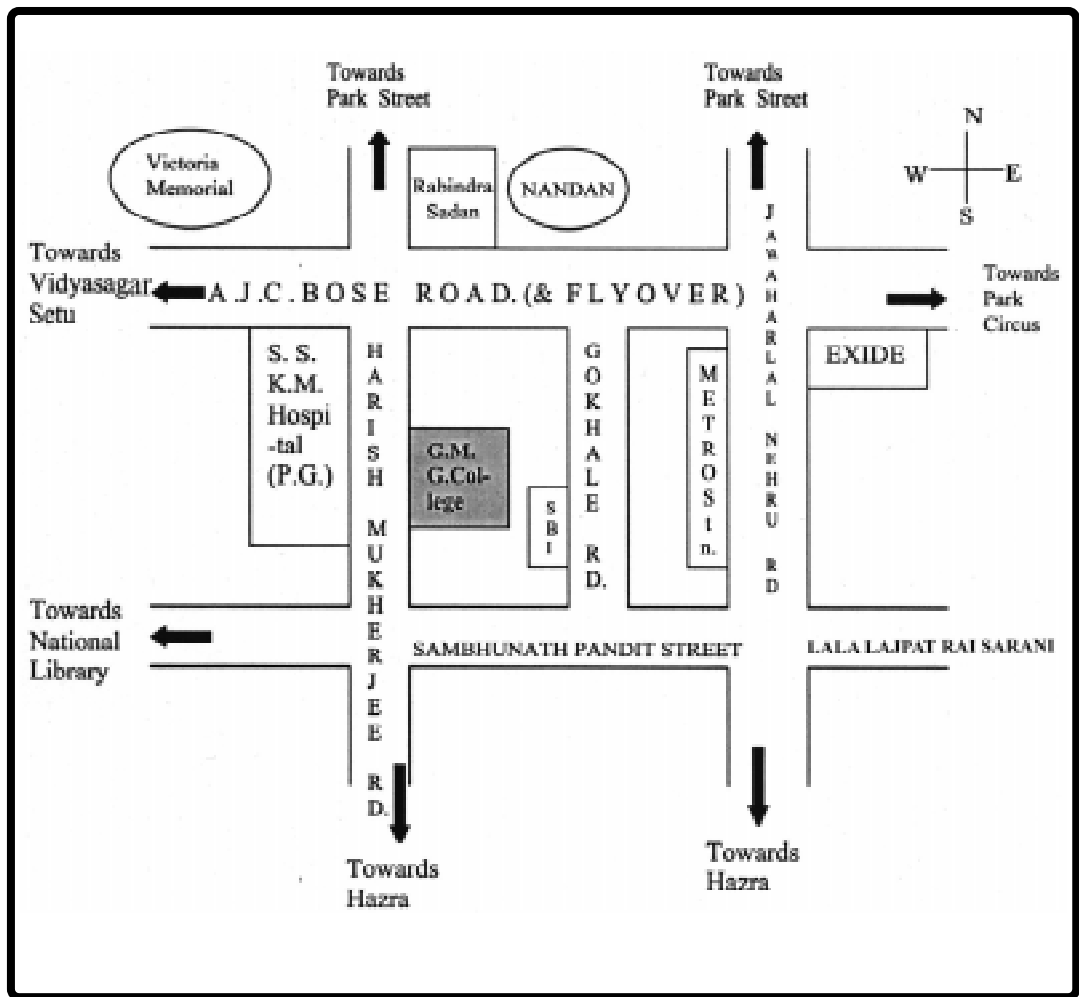

# GOKHALE MEMORIAL GIRLS' COLLEGE

## 1. LOCATION

The Gokhale Memorial Girls' College is conveniently located on Harish Mukherjee Road, opposite SSKM Hospital and is easily accessible from various parts of Kolkata, Howrah and the suburbs by bus and metro.



## 2. BRIEF HISTORY

Established in 1938 as an extension of Gokhale Memorial Girls' School, Gokhale Memorial Girls' College has emerged today as one of the premier educational institutions in the Eastern part of India in its own right, offering state-of-the-art quality education to countless aspiring female students. Sarala Roy, popularly known as Mrs. P. K. Ray, a great social reformer and educationist, founded the Gokhale Memorial Girls' School in 1920. One of the first Indian women to acquire a University degree, Sarala Ray's primary objective was not merely to churn out women graduates but to train women so as to develop their thoughts and ideals as right citizens, capable home builders and conscientious workers.

This Institution has been named after Gopal Krishna Gokhale, a distinguished teacher, educationist and freedom fighter. Sarala Ray was greatly inspired by his educational aspirations especially for women. The Institution was founded as a memorial to Gokhale, the great patriot of India, to serve the cause of education of girls in the country.

Dr. S. E. Rani Ghosh was the first Principal of the School and College. She founded the College and served it from its inception in 1938 till her death on 18th November 1961. A true educationist, she nurtured the Institution from an Intermediate College of Arts and Science to a Three Year Degree College. Under her guidance, the Institution gained a wide reputation and lived up to the expectations of Gokhale and Sarala Ray.

Gokhale Memorial Girls' College is the first college to be affiliated to teach Psychology by the Calcutta University in 1957 in the Three Year Degree Course.

The college gradually expanded and its affiliation was extended to teach various Honours subjects.

Further, intra-college competitions are held in music, dance, recitation, painting etc. The College also undertakes a number of extension activities such as blood donation camps, nutrition awareness camps in slum areas etc. to inculcate social responsibility in students. There is a student welfare sub-committee to resolve student related issues. The forum enables the students to participate in development and student welfare activities of the College.

The College has a system whereby parents are intimated, if necessary, about their wards' strengths and shortcomings.

## 9. DISCIPLINE

91 Admission of a student in this College implies adherence to the prescribed code of conduct and observance of the rules laid down by the College. Full co-operation in this regard is sought from the guardians. Any student who fails to abide by these rules will not be accommodated.

### 92 RULES

1. The students shall maintain discipline inside and outside the classrooms.
2. The students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
3. Students must come to the College decently attired. Their dress and demeanour under no circumstances shall be unbecoming of a student attending an educational institution.
4. Students must not use cell phones inside the college buildings. Violation of this rule will be penalised by confiscation of the mobile set.
5. Student must consult the College Notice Board everyday and comply, failing which the college will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them.
6. Students must bring the Identity Card (issued by the College) everyday. They must produce the Identity Card whenever required for any official work.
7. No student is allowed to attend coaching classes, join other courses of study or engage herself in any other activity, whatsoever, during college hours.
8. Attendance at college examinations and tutorials is compulsory for the students.
9. Students must maintain decent and cordial relationship with the faculty and staff and amongst themselves.
10. Students must participate in all extra-curricular activities organized by the institution.
11. RAGGING IN ANY FORM IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

- Students shall strictly abide by the Rules and Regulations of the College.
- Students shall not, by their act or conduct, demonstrate any disrespect to the Principal, teaching or non-teaching staff of the college.
- Students shall not, by their act or conduct, cause damage to the reputation of the institution.
- Students shall not damage property or cause financial loss to the college. In the event the college suffers any damage or loss, financial or otherwise, the concerned student will be liable for compensation of such loss.
- Proposals for students' welfare and appeals for solution of problems connected with academic and co-curricular activities in the College shall be submitted in writing either to the Principal or to the Convenor, Student Welfare Subcommittee. The decision of the Principal in such matters will be final.
- Students shall not in any manner try to influence or interfere with any decision taken by the academic bodies and the authority of the college.
- A student may submit a written representation to the College authority for redress of grievance, if any. The decision of the College authority, in such matters, shall be final.
- A student shall not commit or cause breach of peace inside and around the College campus.

## 94 ATTENDANCE

Minimum percentage of attendance required by a student in the degree course is 75% of the lectures delivered in each subjects including tutorials and practical classes in accordance with the Regulations of the Calcutta University.

### IMPORTANT

A student attending less than 75% but more than 60% of the lectures delivered in any subject will be allowed to fill in the forms for appearing in the B.A./B.Sc. final examinations only on payment of fees prescribed by the Calcutta University for condonation of short percentage.

A student who attends less than 60% of the lectures delivered in any subject will not, under any circumstance, be allowed to fill in forms for the B.A./B.Sc. Final Examinations.

## 10. LIBRARY

The College has a well-stocked library with more than 25,000 books. There is an open-shelf system. Students may borrow books and use the reading- room as well. The library has a Network Resource Centre which the students may access during library hours, free of additional charge. The library also subscribes to academic journals. Books that are not allowed to be issued may be photocopied from the College Reprographic Centre.

### 10.1 RULES OF THE LIBRARY

1. On production of the Identity card, each student will be provided with Borrower's Cards against which books will be issued. Library Cards are non-transferable.
2. Loss of this card must be reported immediately to the Librarian and a fresh card will be issued on payment of fine.
3. Honours and Major course students may borrow two books at a time. Books must be returned within 15 days from the date of issue.
4. If the books are returned after the due date, borrowing facility will be temporarily withdrawn.
5. Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. Till the damage is made good, the borrower will have no right to use the library.
6. Books will not be issued on Saturdays. Reading room will, however, remain open.
7. Students must renew their library cards after taking fresh admission in the second year and third year.
8. Students seeking transfer and students appearing in Part I, Part II and Part III Examinations must obtain a clearance certificate from the librarian before a transfer certificate or admit card is issued.

## 11.COURSES OFFERED

### 11.1 BA/B.Sc.HONOURS DEGREE COURSE

- DURATION : 3 YEARS
- GENERAL INFORMATION : (Subject to change if University Regulations change)

A student opting for B.A./B.Sc. Honours Degree Course must study the following Subjects :

- i) One Honours subject consisting of eight papers of 100 marks each
- ii) Two elective subjects each consisting of three papers of 100 marks each.
- ii) Compulsory English and one Modern Indian Language each carrying 50 marks.
- iv) Environmental Studies consisting of one paper carrying 100 marks.

## 11.1.1 BENGALI HONOURS COURSE:

### 11.1.1.1 THE DEPARTMENT

Enhanced with a proper teaching methodology and academic planning right from its inception, the department has been able to move ahead leaving behind visible footprints of success and improvement. As the study of Bengali language and literature cannot be limited through the boundaries of the current curriculum, the department has endeavoured to provide the students with an overall knowledge of literary criticism, past and present. Frequent special lectures by faculties of the colleges and eminent speakers are arranged along with interactive sessions so that the students are encouraged towards a sound creative speculation.

### 11.1.1.2 PROSPECTS OF THE COURSE:

- Higher studies in the University of Calcutta or other reputed Universities.
- Studies in the field of Advertising, Media, Journalism, Print Media and Publishing Houses and opportunities for employment in these areas.
- Suitable job orientation as junior research associate, in college libraries and universities.
- Eligibility through School Service Commission Examinations and other sources as teaching faculty in schools at the primary, secondary and Higher Secondary levels.

### 11.1.1.3 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

- Must pass Higher Secondary Examination (+2 course) of WBCHSE not earlier than the year 2007 with 55% marks in aggregate and 55% marks in Bengali A or 90% marks in Bengali B.

OR

- Must pass Examination equivalent to Higher Secondary Examination of WBCHSE not earlier than the year 2007 with 5 recognized subjects (of full marks not less than 100 each) of which at least one shall be English with 50% marks in aggregate and 55% marks in Bengali A or 80% marks in Bengali B.
- SC/ST candidates are eligible for admission with 40% aggregate or 40% marks in Bengali.

## 11.1.2 ECONOMICS HONOURS COURSE

### 11.1.21 THE DEPARTMENT

The first batch of students was admitted in the academic session 1984-85 and graduated in the year 1987.

The Department has three full time faculty and the requisite number of guest faculty. Visiting faculties from other eminent institutions enrich the students by delivering lectures in a particular field of specialization.

Quite a number of students come out with excellent results in the University examination. In 2009, a student of this department stood first in Economics Honours in C.U.

Preparation of final examination is facilitated through regular class-room lectures, provision of relevant reference materials and notes.

Students are encouraged to conduct project work on current economic problems outside the purview of the course curricula.

Parent -teacher meetings are conducted on regular basis to discuss student progress.

### 11.1.22 PROSPECTS OF THE COURSE:

- Pursuing higher studies in Economics, Applied Economics, and allied subjects (like Foreign Trade, Quantitative Economics, Labour Economics and other fields of Social Science) in different reputed universities all over India including the Calcutta University.
- Pursuing higher studies in Management and Finance.
- Job prospects in currently growing Banking and Insurance Sector.
- Prospect of being absorbed in Actuarial business is particularly bright for students in the discipline of Economics with Mathematics.
- Students with a flair for writing in English/Bengali may choose careers in Journalism particularly in the field of socio-political issues.

### 11.1.23 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

- Must pass Higher Secondary Examination (+2 course) of WBCHSE not earlier than the year 2007 with at least
  1. 60% marks in aggregate and 60% marks in Mathematics or,
  2. 60% marks in aggregate and 55% marks in Mathematics with Pass marks in Statistics

OR

- Must pass Examination equivalent to Higher Secondary Examination of WBCHSE not earlier than the year 2007 with 5 recognized subjects (of full marks not less than 100 each) of which at least one shall be English with at least
  1. 60% marks in aggregate and 60% marks in Mathematics or,
  2. 60% marks in aggregate and 55% marks in Mathematics with Pass marks in Statistics
- SC/ST candidates are eligible for admission with 40% aggregate and 40% in Mathematics, or 40% in Mathematics and 40% in Statistics.
- Must have Pure Mathematics in WBCHSE.
- Must have Pure Mathematics / Business Mathematics in Examination equivalent to H.S. Examination of WBCHSE.

## EDUCATION HONOURS COURSE

### 11.1.31 THE DEPARTMENT:

The purpose of education is to develop the knowledge, skill, or character of students.

Keeping this purpose in mind, the Education Department of Gokhale Memorial Girls' College strives to achieve its obligation and responsibility towards its students. It puts in its best efforts to make sure that students after graduating are able to lead their lives as respectable members of the society.

Girls have not only done well in the field of higher education, but have also successfully established themselves in various other sectors, such as, Human Resource Department of the MNCs, Banking, Administrative Service, etc.

From the year 2008, practical lessons on pedagogy and statistics were incorporated in the curriculum and the Department is successfully conducting the practical classes.

### 11.1.32 PROSPECTS OF THE COURSE:

- Higher studies in the Calcutta University or other reputed Universities and Institutions
- Students may get opportunity for joining the Masters course in Social Work (MSW) and move into the field of humanitarian service.
- Occupations for which one can opt are teachers, lecturers, school inspectors, guidance officers, counsellors, educational managers, officers in education department, educational administrators etc.
- Students may also join MBA/courses after graduation.

### 11.1.33 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

- Must pass Higher Secondary Examination (+2 course) of WBCHSE not earlier than the year 2007 with 55% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in Education or related subject. (Psychology, Philosophy, Mathematics, Sociology, Economics, Political Science and History.)

Or

- Must pass Examination equivalent to Higher Secondary Examination of WBCHSE not earlier than the year 2007 with 5 recognized subjects (of full marks not less than 100 each) of which at least one shall be

English with at least 55% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in education or related subject.

- SC/ST candidates are eligible for admission with 40% aggregate and/ or 40% in the subject or related subject.

#### 11.1.34 SUBJECT COMBINATIONS AND COURSE FEES:

- Campus recruitment for Electronics was started from 2007 with WIPRO BPO and TCS being the two companies who have recruited students of the electronics department in their final year.
- The department continues to do its good work despite facing stiff competition from Engineering Colleges in and around the city those offer BE in electronics.

## ENGLISH HONOURS COURSE

### 11.1.51 DEPARTMENT

This College offers a three-year Degree Course with Honours in English language and Literature

There are eight papers covering a wide spectrum of literature in English across the centuries, with special features like Creative Writing in Paper VII which trains a student to become a writer in future.

Paper VII has interesting feature called Creative Writing which trains a student to become a writer the technical aspect of a poem/skit/short story or even a travelogue or a dialogue are taught. For many a future writer this can be the first important step. In fact, we have had students who in their third year participated in Essay competitions and won and published poems online. Paper VIII includes Indian Writings in English, American Literature and Indian Writings in Translation and no matter which option the Department takes the students stand to gain as they venture beyond the domain of English Literature

In the academic Session 1965-1966, this Department, under the aegis of the University of Calcutta, offered the English Honours Course for the first time. Now there are four full-time teachers and Guest Faculty as well and the focus is not just on teaching texts and the art of writing good answers but also on creating literary awareness. So Seminars are organized, eminent speakers are invited, students are encouraged to contribute to Wall Magazines and read Papers in Class. As and when possible, teachers of the Department guide students to make the best possible use of both our library that has a very good collection of books and the Internet. Since parental guidance and monitoring is essential, the Department invites guardians to interact with the Teachers along with their wards as and when necessary. Students are also encouraged to present papers in class as a preparatory step to research activities in future.

#### Future Prospects :

After graduation our students can apply to Universities and Colleges that offer Post-Graduate Courses in English Literature. Those less interested in 'conventional' higher study can branch out and study even for a Degree in Management or take up courses in Language, Publishing, Media, Computers, etc. Some of our students are in the Corporate World now. We are happy to mention that many of our students are working for their Doctoral Degree here in India and abroad and there are some who are now Lecturers/Guest Faculty in other Colleges. Our students have joined our Institution too as Guest Faculty. Avenues are many in number and all wide open for the sincere and diligent.

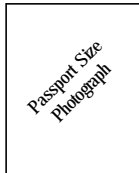
